

1. History of the Department

The **history** of the Department of Sanskrit, DU begins with the history of the University itself. The Department came into existence in 1922 when the University had come into existence. During the first two years of its commencement the Department ran without postgraduate students. It was only in 1924 that the Department had one student in its M.A. program. Following the practice of the time **Mahamahopadhyaya Pandit Lachhmi Dhar Kalla**, the senior most of the teachers among the constituent colleges of the University occupied the position of Teacher-in-charge of the Department. As the Department had no faculty members of its own, officially recognized some of the senior teachers from the colleges as Readers.

Pandit **Lachhmi Dhar Kalla**, the first in-charge of the Department belonged to St. Stephen's College. Those days the Postgraduate classes of the subject of Sanskrit were held at St. Stephen's College. Pandit Kalla pioneered the research programs in the Department of

Sanskrit. He had come to the department with an illustrious background to his credit. After completing an archeological apprenticeship under Sir John Marshal, he had joined St. Stephen's College as a lecturer in October 1916. He was an elected member of the Royal Asiatic Society. Apart from being well-versed in several Indian languages, he had the knowledge of Persian, Arabic, Greek, Latin, German, French, Russian and English. His books 'The Birthplace of Kalidasa' and 'The Homeland of Aryans' got high accreditations from the scholars across the globe. It goes without saying that his contributions in building the Department are unparalleled.

Dr. N.N.Choudhuri of Ramjas College took over as Head of the Department in the year 1949. A full-fledged University Department saw its inception only in the year 1953 when a post of Reader in Sanskrit was created and filled up.

Dr. N. N. Choudhuri of Ramjas College, who was already working as the Head of the Department, was appointed in the said position of Reader and was asked to take over as the first regular Head. In 1955 a position of Professor was created. Dr. N. N. Choudhuri was appointed as the first Professor. For a long time the principal focus of the Department was to

provide instructions to Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses. Research occupied prime attention only a few years later. Dr. Ram Gopal was the first Ph.D. student of the Department in the academic year 1953-54. Even in the late fifties, there used to be only five or six students in its M.A. program and one or two students in Ph.D. program. This situation continued for a number of years. It was only during the early sixties that a marked improvement in the numbers of students was seen. From being a small Department it has now grown to be one of the biggest Departments in the University with more than three hundred postgraduate students, more than one hundred fifty research scholars and more than one hundred fifty teachers in colleges and the University Department.

The Department of Sanskrit enjoys the pride of having some of the stalwarts in the subject as its faculties in the past. Prof. R V Joshi, an internationally acclaimed Sanskritist introduced the modern European research methods to the Department. He is the recipient of Sahitya Academy award and 'Pravasi Bhartiya Sammana'.

The special feature of the creative strength of Prof. Joshi has been his ability to author in Hindi, Sanskrit, French, Spanish and Latin with equal ease. He has the credits of publishing books and articles in all these languages. He has published the books from USA, Europe and India. He has composed fifteen Kāvyas and Mahākāvyas in Sanskrit and has edited and translated several books with detailed introductions and critical notes. Dr. Joshi has published more than thirty eight books and hundreds of scholarly articles in national and international journals. Some of his major works are 'Satyam' - The Eternal Truth, Radhāpanchashati, Upasanacintamani (A book in eight volumes consisting of 400 pages), Swarnamala - An

Encyclopedia in four volumes, Bhaktimimansa in four volumes, Shivalinga Rahasya, an epic Ramapratapacaritam in two volumes, Yogsutra Patanjali (in Spanish), Laxmi-nrsimhasahasra-nama-stotras, Vide di un Saggio Parma, Italia etc.

Prof. Satyavrat Shastri, former Professor and Head of the Department is another highly acclaimed Sanskrit scholar, writer, grammarian and poet. He has written three Mahakavyas, three Khandakavyas, one Prabandhakavya, one Patrakavya and five works in critical writings in Sanskrit.

During his career he has won many national and international awards including the Sahitya Akademi Award for Sanskrit. Sahitya Academy conferred on him an award in the year 1968 for his poetry work, *Srigurugovindasimhacharitam*. He became the first recipient of the Jñanpith Award in Sanskrit language. He also served as Vice-Chancellor of Shri jagannath Sanskrit University, Puri, Odisha.

Dr. S S Rana, Former Reader of the Department served as Dean of the Colleges, University of Delhi for more than 12 years. He also served as Principal of Shivaji College, University of Delhi.

Prof. Vachaspati Upadhaya, the former Professor and Head of the Department served as Vice-Chancellor of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, New Delhi for a longest period of time (1994 to 2011).

Prof. Satyapal Narang, Former Professor and Head of the Department served as Director, Institute Francaisede Indologies, Pondicherry.

Former Professor and Head of the Department Dipti Sharma Tripathi served as Director of National manuscript Mission, Government of India for two consecutive terms -2010-2014.

Dr. Shashi Prabha Kumar, former Professor of the Department served as Founder Vice-Chancellor, Sanchi University of Buddhist-Indic Studies, Sanchi, MP. She also served as Chairperson, School of Sanskrit and Indic Studies, JNU, New Delhi.

3. Vision and Mission

i. Vision

- Introducing the students with the various branches of Indian knowledge system, culture & civilization.
- Promoting the research of Shastric Texts using modern methodology and ways of interpretation.
- Identifying such aspects of Ancient Indian Wisdom depicted in Sanskrit Shastric and Literary works reflected in Indian Culture coping up with modern era without losing its essence.
- Promoting the Interdisciplinary Studies related to Sanskrit, Prakrit, Arabic, Persian etc.
- Focusing the editing, interpreting and critically analyzing Sanskrit Manuscripts.
- Establishing an audio-visual lab for preserving the different ways of Shakha specific recitations of Vedic Hymns. .
- Planning to start a five year integrated course consisting of all dimensions of Indic Studies with 50 seats at the initial stage.
- Rewriting the chronology of Sanskrit Literature using modern tools in the light of Textual, Archaeological, Linguistic evidences etc.
- Starting the following certificate/Diploma/P.G. Diploma courses.
 - > Certificate Course in Indian Philosophy.
 - ➤ Diploma in Sanskrit Linguistics.
 - > PG Diploma in Vedic Mathematics (one year).
 - > PG Diploma in Epigraphy and Paleography (one year).
 - > PG Diploma in Jyotish (one year).
 - ➤ Computer application course for Sanskrit students.

ii. Mission

- Implementing the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) at PG level.
- Improving the skill of students in spoken Sanskrit.
- Providing a conducing environment for learning that prepares the students to achieve all types of meaningfulness in their lives as responsible individuals as well as global citizens.

4. Special Features and Contributions

- i. The Department of Sanskrit of the University of Delhi is the richest and biggest of all Sanskrit Study Centers in the world offering most of the major fields of Sanskrit Studies like Veda, Darshana, Sahitya, Sanskrit Bhasha and Vyakarana, Dharmashastra, Epigraphy & Palaeography, Modern Sanskrit Literature, Itihasa and Purana, Bharatiya Jyotisha Shastra etc. at PG and Research levels.
- ii. The variety of research topics taken for studies during the last more than six decades indicates that the Department has endeavored to cover all areas of Sanskrit Studies like Veda, Darshan, Sahitya, Sanskrit Bhasha and Vyakaran, Dharmashastra, Epigraphy, Modern Sanskrit Literature, Itihas and Purana, Bharatiya Jyotisha Shastra.
- iii. The Department has contributed some remarkable researches demolishing the established western theories of Indology e.g.
 - (i) Mahamahopadhyaya Dr. Laxmidhar Kalla, the founder Head of the Department was the first scholar who established OIT theory against Aryan Migration Theory.
 - (ii) The research work entitled 'India known to Kalpasutras' by Dr. Ram Gopal, the first Ph.D. of the Department, plays key role in fixing the time of Kalpasutra Literature from 1200 BCE to 400 BCE.
- iv. This is the first Sanskrit Department in the country to offer Paleography and Epigraphy as optional papers at Post-Graduate and research level studies.
- v. The Department is dedicated to research and development in the field of Sanskrit as well as inter-disciplinary areas like: Veda, Science and Technology in Sanskrit Texts, Researches based on Indian and Western Philosophy, Computational linguistics, Itihas-Purana, Modern Sanskrit literature, Epigraphy, Astrology, Ayurveda etc.
- vi. During the last nine decades of Sanskrit learning at UG/PG levels and more than six decades at Research level, thousands of students have been awarded the Under Graduate and Post Graduate degrees and more than 1000 students have been awarded the M. Phil. and Ph.D. degrees. Faculty members like M M Lakshmidhar Kalla, Prof. N.N. Chaudhuri, Prof. Satyavrat Shastri and Prof. R.V.Joshi have served the Department contributing the national and international methods of Indological learning.

5. Courses offered

The Department offers three levels of regular courses leading to the degrees of MA, M. Phil. and Ph. D. Apart from the said degree courses, the Department provides the learners with opportunities to learn the subjects at different levels. The Department runs two preliminary courses namely certificate

and diploma in Sanskrit. These courses have been designed in a manner that after passing them the student can pursue a postgraduate programme.
